

# What is a Watchman?

Memory Verse – Ezekiel 22:30 “And I sought for a man among them, that should make up the hedge, and stand in the gap before me for the land, that should not destroy it: but I found none.”

Text: Ezekiel 22: 23-31

A good watchman will:

1. Have close communion with God (Ezekiel 22:23, John 11:49)
  - a) Meditates on God’s Word (Psalms. 119:9,11,15-16)
    1. The Holy Spirit illumination (I Corinthians 2:8-11)
  - b) Spends time in prayer (Mark 13:33)
  - c) Obeys God’s direction (Ephesians 4:30)
2. Help others to have a close communion with God by sharing the truth (Ezekiel 24:19)
  - a) Shares personal testimony (Ezekiel 24:19)
  - b) Helps people evaluate the condition of their relationship with God. (James 1:23)
  - c) Helps people understand God and his principles.
3. Be a protector of those in their care (Ezekiel 22:25)
  - a) Watches for false teachers and false doctrines walking circumspectly (Romans 16:17, Philippians 3:17)
  - b) Will not profit from his work.
4. Keeps himself holy and will not participate in:
  - a) Conspiracy (Ezekiel 22:25)
    1. Prophets often worked alone, but never worked as a group to conspire
  - b) Scare tactics to manipulate people to conformity. (Ezekiel 22:25)
  - c) Devour souls, treasures and precious things (Ezekiel 22:25)
  - d) Ignoring God’s law and failing to keep his things Holy, such as the Sabbath (Ezekiel 22:26)
  - e) Creating confusion by removing distinctions between the clean and the unclean, holy and profane. (Ezekiel 22:26)
  - f) Activities or thoughts that defile God or himself (Ezekiel 22:26)
  - g) Speak empty and false words of comfort (Ezekiel 22:28)
5. Stand in the gap as an intercessor (Ezekiel 22:30) – as Abraham did for the righteous people in Sodom and Gomorrah
  - a) A consequence for failure (Ezekiel 31)
  - b) A call – will commit, or recommit to being a faithful watchman?
